PROJECT PRIDE INSTRUCTIONS

1. **SAFETY IS NO ACCIDENT. Your safety is our 1st priority.**
2. **All groups must have at least one adult worker.**
3. Experience Project Pride with our youth. If you cannot work together with your child, make arrangements with an adult who can. **Do not drop off your child at the starting locations;** they need transportation and supervision at the assigned roadway.
4. Dress for the mess: **boots, gardening or winter gloves, plastic gloves, rain gear if necessary and VERY BRIGHT clothing.**
5. Instructions, locations, trash bags, and safety materials will be provided at the two starting locations.
6. Today only, you will need to walk with the direction of traffic. On the major roadways, a vehicle, with flashers on, should follow the group. A second vehicle could lead the group.
7. Pick up litter from the roadside and ditches only; stay on the road side of the guardrail.
8. Work one side of the road at a time. When you cross the road, **cross as a group.**
9. Stay on the side of the road. Do not pick up litter in the middle of the road.
10. DO NOT PICK UP BROKEN GLASS. It will slice through the bag and possibly injure you.
11. **Knot or tie off the bags and leave them on the roadside if you are working on a major roadway. Do not overfill bags. If you are in a neighborhood, you can place the bags out for the regular trash pickup or bring the bags back to the headquarter site dumpster.**
12. Unusual litter like car batteries, tires, paint, or aerosol cans is considered hazardous waste. Place it near the filled trash bags.
13. **The following unusual items should not be collected:** any containers that have tubing attached; picnic coolers, gas cylinders, propane tanks or camping stoves; large piles of cold medication packages, respiratory masks or coffee filters. **Please contact police.**
14. Paramedics will be available if an injury occurs. **Call Bath at 330-666-3733, Richfield at 330-659-9400, or call 911.**
15. Please return all equipment, including the safety vests, to your starting location, school or police department.
